Written and first performed in 1606 - early 1607, Shakespeare's play was originally published in the First Folio in 1623 It is the last of the trilogy of love tragedies which also includes Romeo and Juliet and Othello Like all of Shakespeare's plays, even though Antony and Cleopatra was written long

Macbeth

William Shakespeare (baptised 26 April 1564 - died 23 April 1616) was an English poet and playwright, widely regarded as the greatest writer in the English language and the world's pre-eminent dramatist He is often called England's national • King Lear (1606)

William Shakespeare

1604 Written during Shakespeare's great tragic period, which also included the composition of Hamlet (1600), King Lear (1604-5), Macbeth (1606), and Antony and Cleopatra (1606-7), Othello is set against the backdrop of the wars between Venice and Turkey that raged in the latter part of the sixteenth century

in 1606, when the actor (a boy—more about that later) playing Lady Macbeth died backstage Shakespeare himself had to step into the role The Globe Theater The first performance of Macbeth was held before King James at Hampton Court Palace However, in Shakespeare's time most plays were performed in outdoor public theaters
